Vaisakhi Vibes: Culture, Dance & Devotion




A critical writing competition was organized for Classes 5 to 8 on the topic "Relevance of Anglo-Vedic Education in the Modern World". Students explored how the fusion

RTE Admission Process Ensures Transparency and Equal Opportunity

Applications for admission under the Right to Education (RTE) Act were accepted from 10 March to 8 April in schools, total 67 forms has been accepted. Following the submission period, the list of eligible and non-eligible applicants was released on 10 April. To ensure fairness, claims and objections were invited from parents and guardians on 19 April, allowing them to raise any concerns regarding the eligibility status. After addressing all claims, the final list of 39 eligible applicants was published on 25 April. Subsequently, on 29 April, a transparent lottery system was conducted where 23 applicants are selected for admission. This process upheld the principles of transparency and equal opportunity, ensuring that deserving children, especially from underprivileged backgrounds, received their rightful chance to quality education. The systematic and structured approach reinforced public trust in the RTE admission process, aiming to bridge educational inequalities across society.

Encouraging improvement: Supplementary Exams successfully

On 24 April, our school conducted compartment examinations for students of Classes 5 to 9 and Class 11, in accordance with CBSE guidelines. These exams were organized for students who had not passed one or more subjects in the annual exams. Understanding the importance of fair opportunities, the school also allowed students who were absent due to medical reasons to appear for the exams on a later date. Prior to the exams, special remedial classes were arranged to help students strengthen their understanding of the subjects and prepare effectively. The school staff and teachers provided full support and guidance, creating a positive and encouraging environment. This initiative reflects the school's commitment to every student's academic success and personal growth. By offering both academic support and a second chance, the school ensures that no student is left behind and that each one has the opportunity to improve and succeed.
